**2022 Department 139<sup>th</sup> Annual Encampment**

At the 138<sup>th</sup> Department Midterm meeting called to order on November 13, 2021, notice was given for the date and location for the 2022 139<sup>th</sup> Annual Encampment.

By the authority vested in me as Commander of the Department of Illinois, Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, by the National Constitution and Regulations, the National Policies, and the By-Laws of this Department, it is hereby ordered as follows:

1. The 139<sup>th</sup> Annual Department of Illinois Encampment shall take place on May 14, 2022 at the McClean County History Museum located at 200 North Main Street, Bloomington, Illinois. The details for lunch and agenda will be set and disseminated to the Camps at a later date.
2. The 139<sup>th</sup> Annual Department of Illinois Encampment shall be in person with a limited number to be allowed to attend virtually per National C&R regulations Chapter II, Article III, Section 1 (a) that states: All such meetings shall be in person. The Department Commander may allow a limited number of brothers to attend virtually.

NOTE: Should pandemic restrictions on in-person meetings be reapplied within the State subpart (b) shall apply: When a state of emergency exists as the result of a declaration by the President of the United States, the Governor of a State, Territory or Possession, or local government officials who have the authority to declare a state of emergency which prevents a department from meeting, the Department Commander may allow the Department to meet virtually through the issuance of a Department Order.

3. Credential Cards shall be required for voting and a list of attendees shall be compiled and sent to the Department Secretary in advance.

The foregoing Department Order is proclaimed this **15<sup>th</sup>** day of **November**, in the year of our Lord Two Thousand Twenty one, and of the Independence of the United States of America, the Two Hundred Forty-fifth year.
